I think it might be fair to say that this past year has been the most demanding of years for all of us.

I wonder, can you remember what the evening of the first Lockdown was like for you?

For me, like many, it was a mixture of slight panic and anxiety. I do not think I was deeply anxious, but I can recall having many thoughts racing through my mind and trying to formulate a way of 'managing' the edge of something I had never known before.

On reflection, I guess I naively thought that things might be difficult for a few weeks or may be a month or two... In many respects I am glad I was spared the knowledge of what the coming year would bring.

In the past, we may have taken many of the normal things of life for granted. The ease of meeting with friends and family, the forward planning of special events, the anticipation of so many hoped for things... Even now, a year into a world we could not have imagined we still wrestle with uncertainty...

So yes, this past year has taken its toll on many of us.

The recovery from this third Lockdown has been most poignant for me. So much to reflect upon and so much to learn from over this past year.

Given this past year, I now ponder the Gospel accounts of the days leading up to and culminated in the death and resurrection of Jesus, in a way I have never done before. I mean that from the perspective of the close friends and followers of Jesus, they too must have felt like their world was turned upside down, sick with anxiety...

The Easter message, first heard by those bewildered friends and follows of Jesus, still has its power to speak of new life and new beginnings. We read in Luke chapter 24: 36, 'While they were talking about this, (the account of Jesus on the road to Emmaus) Jesus himself stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."

In the knowledge of the new life and new beginnings that the Easter story of the resurrected Jesus brings, may we each be messengers of the peace and hope that is at the heart of the wonderful story.





## **WHY?**

A great big stone covered the tomb so His body could not be seen,

And while we were all mourning, and God only knows how,

His only Son had conquered death and is here with us now.

Now I know why He allowed it, praise the Lord I know for sure,

That 2,000 year ago Jesus' Blood gave me life for evermore;

Yes, 2,000 years ago Jesus' Blood opened heaven's door.

## **WHY EASTER WILL NEVER GO AWAY**

How do you make sense of the Resurrection? Dead men don't rise, so why believe that this particular dead man *did* rise?

At the end of St Luke's gospel we read that: "they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement" (Luke 24.4) This is highly significant. The Gospels do not show us a group of disciples who were in a receptive frame of mind. After the crucifixion, they were in hiding, frightened and scattered. Then suddenly, they came out of hiding and were totally different; excited, joyful. By Pentecost they were confident, with one firm message: 'You crucified Jesus, but God raised Him up!'

How did they know this? Because of direct personal experience. Some of them had visited the tomb of Jesus: it was empty. Others claimed to have seen and touched the risen Lord. Were they hallucinating? People can hallucinate in groups – when taking drugs, for example. But of course, each one will see a different hallucination. But the disciples all saw the same thing. Or rather, the same person - Jesus. Were they lying? Jesus had died a humiliating death as a criminal. Perhaps they wanted to rescue His good name. So, did they pretend they had seen Him?

This theory has a big problem. Their preaching led them into trouble with the authorities. They were beaten and imprisoned and some of them killed. People will die for ideas and causes which they believe in passionately. But not for things they have made up. We might suffer for our convictions, but we will not suffer for our inventions.

What about the 'swoon' theory? That Jesus didn't die on the cross, despite terrible wounds? That He recovered in the tomb, and then escaped? That the disciples nursed Him back to health? But Roman soldiers knew when a man was dead; and there was the guard on the tomb. Also, the events which followed simply don't fit. If the disciples had been hiding Jesus all along, they would have kept very low-key, and out of the way, so that the authorities did not come after Him again.

Besides, to preach that God had raised Jesus from the dead – which is exactly what they did preach – would have been a lie. Beatings and threat of death would soon have loosened their tongues. Inventions crumble under pressure; convictions hold fast.

Another reason for believing in the Resurrection is this: Jesus' continuing impact. Thousands and soon millions of people in every generation since have shared an inescapable sense of being 'accompanied' through life. Though unseen, they identify this presence as the Risen Lord.

Sometimes this experience of meeting Jesus is gentle and fitful. Sometimes it is dramatic and life changing. This reminds us that the resurrection of Jesus is not just an interesting historical puzzle. It is a vital, present day reality. It brings wonderful comfort, assuring us of the central Christian truths: death is dead; Jesus is alive; God is love.

This central notion was captured, most movingly, by the great Albert Schweitzer: 'He came to those men who knew Him not. He speaks to us the same word: "Follow thou me," and sets us to the tasks which He has to fulfil for our time. He commands. And to those who obey Him, whether they be wise or simple, He will reveal Himself in the toils, the conflicts, the suffering which they shall pass through in His fellowship, and, as ineffable mystery, they shall learn in their own experience who He is.' Have a joyful – and a challenging – Easter.

## **ALL IN THE MONTH OF APRIL**

1900 years ago, on 26<sup>th</sup> April 121 Stoic philosopher (whose works are still read today), was born.

500 years ago, on 27<sup>th</sup> April 1521 that Ferdinand Magellan, Portuguese explorer who led the first expedition to circumnavigate the earth, died at the hands of natives in the Philippines. He was aged 41.

300 years ago, on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 1721 that Robert Walpole became the first British Prime Minister.

250 years ago, on 13<sup>th</sup> April 1771 that Richard Trevithick, British mining engineer and inventor of the first steam locomotive, was born.

125 years ago, from 6<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> April 1896 that the first modern Summer Olympic Games were held in Athens. The original Olympics were banned by the Roman Emperor Theodosius (I or II) in either 393 or 426 AD.

95 years ago, on 21<sup>st</sup> April 1926 that Queen Elizabeth II was born in Mayfair, London. Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Windsor was the first child of the Duke and Duchess of York. Her father became King on the abdication of his brother King Edward VIII in 1936, from which time Elizabeth was the heir presumptive.

90 years ago, on 14<sup>th</sup> April 1931 that the first edition of the Highway Code was published in the UK.

75 years ago, on 21<sup>st</sup> April 1946 that John Maynard Keynes, British economist, died. He was the most influential economist of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, whose ideas formed the basis of Keynesian economics.

70 years ago, on 17<sup>th</sup> April 1951 that the Peak District National Park was established. It was Britain's first national park.

60 years ago, on 11<sup>th</sup> April 1961 that Nazi war criminal Adolf Eichmann went on trial in Jerusalem. He was convicted on 12<sup>th</sup> September and executed in June 1962.

50 years ago, on 6<sup>th</sup> April 1971 that Igor Stravinsky, Russian composer, died. He was one of the most important and influential composers of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

40 years ago, on 11<sup>th</sup> April 1981 that the Brixton riot took place in London. 5,000 youths rampaged through the streets, attacking police officers and damaging buildings, looting shops and setting cars alight.

20 years ago, on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2001 that NASA launched its Mars Odyssey spacecraft to search for evidence of life and volcanic activity on Mars. It went into orbit around Mars and remains operational (though it will run out of propellant in 2025). It is the longest surviving continually active spacecraft orbiting another planet. (It has successfully mapped the distribution of water below the surface and discovered a vast amount of ice below the equatorial regions.)

10 years ago, on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2011 that the wedding of Prince William and Catherine (Kate) Middleton took place at Westminster Abbey in London. They were given the titles the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge.

## **THE GOOD NEWS ABOUT YOUR FORGETFULNESS**

You know the scenario – you go into the lounge and then wonder what you wanted. Or you need to make a phone call but can't find the phone. You go to the cash point and forget your pin number. Or your car keys are lost in the kitchen, but even when you find them and go shopping, you forget stuff on the list.

If at times you find yourself living in an annoying brain-fog, the good news is that it is not because you are ill or getting old. To varying extents, everyone does it.

A recent study at the University of Edinburgh has found that forgetfulness is as common in people in their 20s as it is in people in their 50s. Although some of the people in the study were worried about getting dementia, a neuro-psychiatrist at the university reassured them: "People think that if you are starting to forget things – something like misplacing your keys – that is something to worry about. But it is normal."

Good reasons for forgetting things range from the fact that too much was happening in your life at the time, you were stressed about something, not paying attention to what you were doing, or just too busy thinking about something else entirely.

## **ST GEORGE, OUR PATRON SAINT WHO ISN'T ENGLISH**

The Saint of an English Army before he was Patron Saint of England, St George may have been a soldier, but he was no Englishman. He was an officer in the Roman army under Diocletian, who refused to abandon his faith during the Terror, and was martyred at Lydda in Palestine about the year 300 AD – supposedly 23 April. Over the years St George became the example of a Christian fighting-man, a powerful helper against evil powers affecting individual lives. He was the soldier-hero of the Middle Ages, of whom remarkable deeds were reported.

In the Golden Legend of the 13th century, Jacobus de Voragine gave St George a handsome write-up. The story runs thus:



One day, St George rode up to the heathen city of Sylene in Lybia, where he found the citizens in great distress. A neighbouring dragon had forced them to surrender two sheep each day for its dinner, and when the sheep gave out, two of their children; and now they were about to sacrifice the King's daughter, dressed as if for her wedding. St George encountered the little party by a stagnant lake, where the dragon lived, and persuaded the sobbing Princess to tell him why she was so miserable. At that moment the dragon appeared, looking inexpressibly revolting. The Saint charged, and drove his spear into the gaping mouth. To everyone's amazement, he tumbled the monster over and over.

Then St George borrowed the Princess's girdle, tied it round the dragon's neck, and persuaded her to lead it back to Sylene herself. The sight of her approaching with the befuddled dragon on its makeshift lead emptied the town. When the inhabitants timidly crept back, St George promised to behead the dragon if they would all believe in Jesus Christ and be baptised.

It was a most effective form of evangelism, for everybody said 'yes' at once. So 15,000 people were baptised, and four carts were commissioned to remove the dragon's body.

St George thus became a symbol of the war against evil, and is usually portrayed trampling the dragon of sin under his horse's hoofs. The Crusaders had a vision of him helping them against the Saracens at Antioch, during the first Crusade, and so brought the story of St George back with them from Palestine. Presently England put herself under the protection of the Saint. His day was declared a holiday in 1222. A red cross on a white field is the flag of St George.

## **THE PAIN OF COVID ON OUR YOUNGSTERS**

Five pupils in every classroom are now reckoned to be in need of some clinical support, due to lockdown mental health deterioration.

A recent study by Cambridge University has found that the number of youngsters with mental health problems has increased from one in nine in 2017 to one in six in 2020. Another by Oxford University has found that half of people aged 16-to-25 were reporting mental health problems, with one in four 'unable to cope', according to the Prince's Trust.

Prof Ellen Townsend of the Self-Harm Research Group at Nottingham University said: "young people have really been neglected in this crisis." Combined with the drop in education, the effects of the past year are going to be 'life limiting." She warned that anxiety, depression and self-harm have increased substantially, and that eating disorder referrals have trebled. NSPCC child abuse referrals have risen 43 per cent and domestic violence calls were up by 49 per cent.

## **IN PRAISE OF THE AFTERNOON NAP**

A short nap in the afternoon improves your memory and keeps your brain more agile. People who nap tend to speak more fluently, have greater mental agility, and remember things better than those who do not break up their day with sleep.

Even a five-minute nap can offer your brain a chance to down-time and replenish itself, so that it is 'good to go' again. If you want longer than five minutes, try to stop at 40 minutes, before you enter the deepest stage of sleep. If you do carry on, sleep for two hours, which is a full sleep-cycle. The study was published in the British Medical Journal.

## **THE SUN, THE MOON AND THE STARS**

I previously mentioned in February's article I would report back on the outcomes for the three space probes launched in July 2020 that were headed to Mars.

First, the United Arab Emirates' space agency 'Hope' Mars orbiter successfully entered Mars orbit on February 9<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and has started to take great photographs before it manoeuvres into its science orbit to study daily and seasonal Martian weather cycles.

Second, the Chinese National Space Administration's 'Tianwen' (meaning 'heavenly questions') – 1, which includes an orbiter, a lander and a rover, successfully entered Mars orbit on February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The spacecraft will perform several orbital adjustments before placing itself into a parking orbit from which it will perform an initial survey of candidate landing areas. Engineers will then bide their time before despatching the wheeled robot to the Red Planet's surface in perhaps May or June this year.

Third, NASA's Mars 2020 mission, which includes the 'Perseverance' rover and the 'Ingenuity' helicopter, touched down on Mars on February 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021. It landed in an astro-biologically relevant ancient environment; the Jezero crater. At the time of writing, the Perseverance rover has performed its first short drive across the Martian landscape. If you want to know more, please go to [www.nasa.gov](http://www.nasa.gov), pick 'Missions' and then 'Perseverance Mars Rover'.

Onto the night sky in April – Mars can be seen in the evening sky just south of west for all of the month. At 9 pm on the evening of April 17<sup>th</sup>, the Red Planet will be next to the waxing Moon.

On the sixth of the month at around 6 am, Saturn will be just above and to the left of the crescent Moon due south-east. On the next night Jupiter will be to the left and up from the Moon with Saturn to the right of both.

On the night of the 21<sup>st</sup>/22<sup>nd</sup> the Lyrid meteor shower will be at its maximum appearing in the north-easterly sky at dusk. As this night passes the shower will appear further south until at dawn it may be visible just east of south. These 'shooting stars' are debris from Comet Thatcher but unfortunately the Moon is more than half-full on that evening, which will make seeing any meteors difficult.

On the evening of the 27<sup>th</sup> of the month, at around 9 pm it may just be possible to see Mercury sitting below the Pleiades and above Venus looking west-north-west.



## **EASTER STORY BISCUITS FOR YOUNG CHILDREN**

Prep. Time: 20 minutes

Total Time: 1 day and overnight

### **Ingredients:**

110 grams of pecan nuts

5 grams vinegar

3 egg whites

1 pinch salt

200 grams sugar

large plastic bag

wooden spoon

tape

Bible

### **Instructions:**

Preheat oven to 150C

Place pecans in the plastic bag and let the children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. Read John 19:1-3.

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put vinegar into mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30.

Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. Read John 10:10-11.

Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. Read Luke 23:27.

So far the ingredients are not very appetising...

Add sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Ps. 34:8 and John 3:16.

Beat with a mixer on high speed until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the colour white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.

Fold in broken nuts.

Drop by teaspoons onto non-stick baking parchment-covered baking sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matthew 27:57-60.


Put the baking sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matthew 27:65-66.

**GO TO BED!** Explain that they may feel sad to leave them in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers felt despair when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20 and 22.

On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. Read Matthew 28:1-9.




